





### LOGLINE

The Coronavirus Crisis in South-Burgenland, the southernmost edge of Austria: uncertainty, stagnation, fear of emptiness – VAKUUM describes an in between state in the home region of the filmmaker to which the people are slowly getting used to.

The longing for normality within the state of emergency carries absurd fruits and takes one close to the abyss. Simultaneously it grants new and unexpected perspectives upon the old and familiar.







### SYNOPSIS

VAKUUM is a documentation of the present, a description of the state of affairs at this particular moment in time – Life in the midst of the Coronavirus pandemic in Europe: How does it feel? VAKUUM is a long-term observation that chronicles the Coronavirus pandemic in South-Burgenland, an eastern border region of Austria and the homeland of the filmmaker, through a jigsaw pieced together by diverse Protagonists.

The film grants a wide range of characters the space and time for reflection upon their present emotions and thoughts. From the catholic priest to the club owner, the confectioner, the inn-keeper, the child educator and the elementary school children, the single mother and the elderly couple.

At the same time it portraits the state of a society ridden by the fear of emptiness, but which discovers new and unexpected perspectives on life.







## DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

While in March 2020 Austrian chancellor Sebastian Kurz is announcing the lockdown I am visiting my family in the rural region of Burgenland, Austria. As a filmmaker I feel that I have to document this period. I start filming the empty towns and the nature enclosing them, alone. Slowly I'm realizing that I want to find out how the people of my hometown are coping with the present situation.

I listen to them unbiased and opened. I ask questions and create a space for reflection in the present moment. Filmmaking for me becomes an anchor in these uncertain times.

VAKUUM is my answer to and my way for comprehending life during this pandemic.
